Same-day Registration Qualified persons wanting to register to vote may do so during the One-Stop Voting period with proper ID—NC Driver's license or ID card or Photo ID from a government

Agency. Your address information is required—current utility bill, current bank statement, property tax bill, license to hunt, fish, etc. car registration, public housing or social service agency document, paycheck or W-2 statement, birth certificate, or student ID. The Board of Elections must be able to verify your address by mail by sending you a verification notice. This is your voter registration card.

Precinct Voting: Voters who vote on Election Day **should vote at their correct precinct**, based on the residential address as of 30 days prior to Election Day.

County boards of elections will be able to count **provisional ballots** cast for voters who do not vote at their correctly assigned precinct on Election Day. These ballots will be reviewed and could be a partial count due to the voter not voting in their district for local candidates.

DEADLINES FOR ABSENTEE VOTING BY MAIL for the

2020 General Election

1. All requests are accepted on the approved State Absentee By-Mail Request Form only and ballots are mailed by the Board of Elections Office.
2. Tuesday, Oct 27, 2020, valid in-person requests are accepted for sick and disabled voters at the Board of Elections Office.
3. UOCAVA Ballots must be returned by Nov. 3, 2020 at 5:00 P.M. - Electronic POSTMARKED by Nov. 3, 2020 and received by mail no later than 5:00 P.M. on Nov. 12, 2020.

Reminders on Absentee Voting By Mail:

The Absentee Ballot Envelope where indicated must have **one witness** and the voter's signature or mark.

Only the voter or the voter's near relative or the voter's verifiable legal guardian is allowed to request or return the voter's absentee ballot materials.
