October 4, 2021

The Washington County Board of Commissioners met in a regular meeting on Monday, October 4, 2021 at 6:00 PM in the Commissioners' Room, 116 Adams Street, Plymouth, NC. (Note: Facebook is down therefore we are unable to ZOOM the meeting and livestream it to the County webpage.) Commissioners Tracey Johnson, Ann Keyes, Carol Phelps and Julius Walker, Jr. were present. Also present were County Manager/County Attorney Curtis Potter, Clerk to the Board Julie J. Bennett and Finance Officer Missy Dixon. Commissioner Sexton was unable to attend.

Vice-Chair Johnson called the meeting to order. Commissioner Keyes gave the invocation; County Manager Potter led the Pledge of Allegiance.

<u>DEPARTMENT INFORMATION UPDATE: PLYMOUTH MUNICIPAL AIRPORT (PMA)</u>: Mr. Knapp Brabble, Airport Director gave the following presentation.

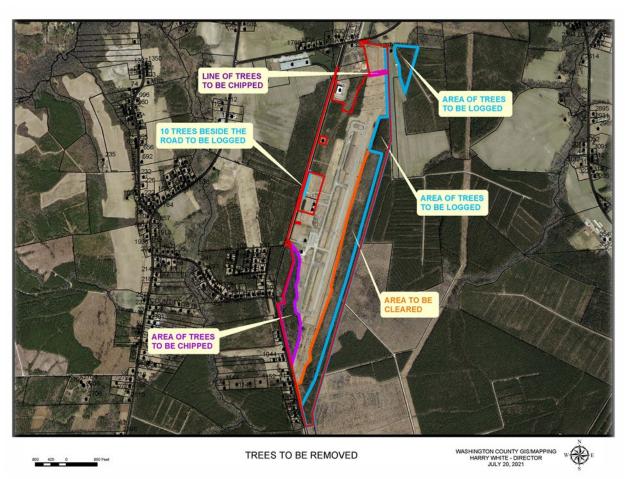












Mr. Brabble said he started working at the PMA in 2005. Mr. Brabble gave a little history of the airport. Originally, the runway was a bit shorter and the airport had been behind the 8-ball because of this. The FAA was petitioned to lengthen the runway. In 2006, construction was started to extend the

runway by 1800 ft., making it 5500 ft., then small props or single engines could land there. However, there is still a weight limit of 100,000 lbs. on the runway. In doing the runway extension, some drainage work had to be done under the runway. In 2012, the PMA was cited by the FAA for trees growing on the runway approach. The County acquired the Stotesberry property to be able to cut down those trees. In 2019, the County got a grant to put in the taxiway to the runway. Mr. Brabble explained that consultants were hired to do our Airport Layout Plan (ALP) which is required by the FAA. This plan will need to be updated every 5 years. If the County doesn't update it, we will be unable to receive federal funding. Item such an AWOS – Airport Weather Operating System—can be contacted for the weather in Plymouth, a terminal building, t-hangars, corporate hangars, and fencing are among the items we are putting in the ALP. The County is going to have to cut some timber also. Emergency Management may be able to get the underbrush chopped rather than sprayed. Mr. Brabble also noted that there is a bump in the runway and he is looking for a way to fix it himself rather than tearing up the runway.

Commissioner Keyes thanked Mr. Brabble for always providing assistance at the Airport when it was needed.

Commissioner Walker asked about how they measure the "21" on the one runway where the FAA said the 1 was too far to the left. Mr. Brabble said they measured it from the center.

Vice-Chair Johnson said she looks forward to seeing the improvements and appreciates all Mr. Brabble does for the Airport.

RESOLUTION 2021-019 ADOPTING REDISTRICTING MAP: Mr. Harry White, GIS/Mapping Director and Mr. Richard Livingston, Lead for North Carolina Fellow (LFNC) presented the following Resolution and Redistricting Map. Mr. Livingston noted that there were over 300 interactions on FB on this topic but no questions. Vice-Chair Johnson asked was there supposed to be a public hearing before approving this. Mr. Potter said no it was not a requirement.

Commissioner Walker said he met with Mr. White about his questions and is now satisfied. Commissioner Phelps said he was satisfied and so was Commissioners Keyes and Johnson.

RESOLUTION 2021-019

ADOPTION OF REDISTRICTING MAP

WHEREAS, the release of the decennial census data requires counties with true electoral Districts to examine their electoral Districts to determine if population balances exist; and

WHEREAS, the Washington County Board of Commissioners uses four true electoral Districts to elect Board Members not At Large; and

WHEREAS, the current electoral Districts for Washington County's Board of Commissioners have significant population imbalances; and

WHEREAS, correcting population imbalances between electoral Districts is a critical part of ensuring the democratic principle of "one person, one vote"; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners is authorized and required by North Carolina General Statutes §153A-22 to revise its District boundaries to correct population imbalances shown by a federal census; and

WHEREAS, County staff has put significant resources into developing new electoral Districts that rectify population imbalances between Districts on an impartial, nonpartisan, and practical basis; and

WHEREAS, on September 7th, 2021 the Board of Commissioners, meeting in a regular meeting, reviewed and considered plans for redrawing the District boundaries; and

WHEREAS, on September 7th, 2021 the Board of Commissioners, meeting in a regular meeting, approved the presentation of multiple redistricting plans for public comment via the internet; and

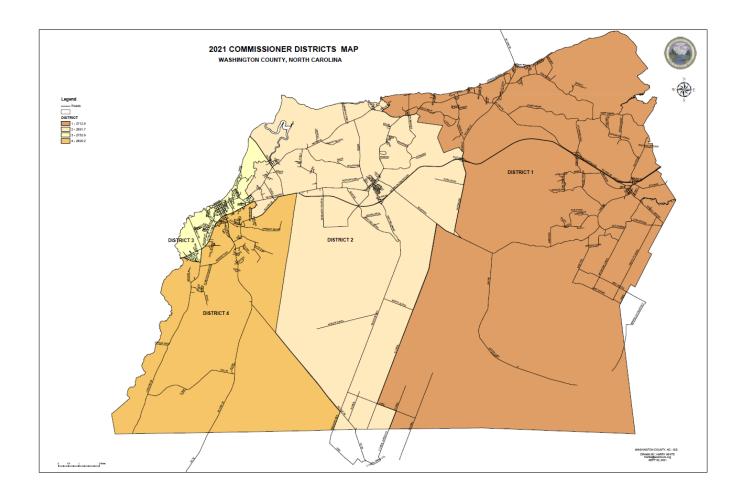
WHEREAS, the attached map corresponds with electoral Districts that meet statutory requirements concerning population parity and District continuity.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Washington County as follows:

- That the County adopts these new Districts represented in the attached map for purposes of electing County Commissioners not At Large.
- The boundaries of the four Districts for the election of the Washington County Board of Commissioners are altered to follow the lines depicted on the attached map.
- The new District boundaries shall be used for the next election of Board Members and for each subsequent election until the boundaries are altered according to law.
- A copy of this resolution and the maps showing the District boundaries shall be retained in the office of the Clerk to the Board.
- That the Clerk to the Board is designated to file these new Districts with all requisite parties as noted in N.C.G.S § 153A-22(f) to include the Secretary of State, Register of Deeds, and the Washington County Board of Elections.

This grant will cover the costs of two generators, one for the locations at the radio station and the other for the location of the tower site on highway 64. This will also cover the cost of a remote control system to monitor if there are any generator failures from the station site. To appropriate EMS Fund Balance to cover the costs of what is being called an Intergovernmental Transfer Fee that is associated with the new Medicaid Managed Care Plans. Previously this fee was pulled out of the Medicaid Cost Settlement however with the new plans, we are being paid at 100% and billed for the IGT Fee Quarterly.
